



## Leveraging the Multiple-Benefits of Integrated Action on Climate and Clean Air to Enhance Ambition in Nationally Determined Contributions

### Background:

The IPCC 1.5°C Special Report concluded that the path we take to reach the 1.5°C target is crucial and the current mitigation ambition in the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) is insufficient to put the world on a safe path. We must change course on emissions in the next decade by addressing all climate forcing emissions, including SLCPs, through ambitious and integrated action.

This event will showcase how the Climate and Clean Air Coalition's multiple benefits pathway framework can empower countries to enhance their mitigation ambition by addressing climate and air quality in an integrated way.

The event will begin with a panel discussion led by CACC Partner countries involved in the CCAC SNAP initiative and will provide concrete examples of how they have used the integrated approach and LEAP-IBC tool to support good decision making, leverage stakeholders, and increase ambition. Panellists will include representatives from Cote d'Ivoire, Nigeria, Norway, and the Philippines.

The country panel will be followed by a short discussion with representatives from the CCAC, WRI, and SEI, to provide examples of how the integrated approach, the LEAP-IBC tool, and SLCPs can be used to enhance ambition in country NDCs and long-term development strategies.
